General Comments:

As a theorist, I think the data base is very hard to use. Especially since I do not use it often. Please make data base more user friendly for "non-experts."

There should be a Root library of ENSDF. ENSDF should use a format that isn't based on punch cards. This is insane.

Make more clear which product does what and consolidate similar products.

There are multiple products providing same information. A more unified version would be nice.

It would be helpful to know (in one place) what each of the eight options at the very top do. I'm not sure if I'm missing some flexibility in use.

Depending on mass region, evaluation is not good enough and we would appreciate if there is some way to post feedback. For instance, in light mass region, a number of papers are not included in ENSDF/XUNDL.

ENSDF: I prefer the "Previous retrieval version". The interface could be better.

NuDat: I would like to have a PDF download option of the plots.
