

⁸⁴Zn

The discovery of ⁸⁴Zn was reported in the 2010 article “Identification of 45 New Neutron-Rich Isotopes Produced by In-Flight Fission of a ²³⁸U Beam at 345 MeV/nucleon,” by Ohnishi et al. ([2010Oh02](#)). The experiment was performed at the RI Beam Factory at RIKEN, where the new isotopes were created by in-flight fission of a 345 MeV/nucleon ²³⁸U beam on a beryllium target. ⁸⁴Zn was separated and identified with the BigRIPS superconducting in-flight separator. The list of new isotopes discovered in this study are summarized in a table. Twenty-two individual counts for ⁸⁴Zn were recorded.
