In 1920, Aston identified ⁷⁵As as reported in “The constitution of the elements” ([1920As02](#)). ⁷⁵As was observed with the Cavendish mass spectrograph. “Phosphorus (atomic weight 31.04) and arsenic (atomic weight 74.96) are also apparently simple elements of masses 31 and 75 respectively.”
