

## <sup>87</sup>Rb

The discovery of stable <sup>87</sup>Rb was reported by Aston at the Cavendish Laboratory in Cambridge, UK, in his 1921 paper “The constitution of the alkali metals” ([1921As03](#)). The positive anode ray method was used to identify <sup>87</sup>Rb with the Cavendish mass spectrograph. “Rubidium (atomic weight 85.45) gives two lines two units apart of relative intensity about 3 to 1. Comparison with the potassium line 39 gives these the masses 85 and 87 to within a fraction of a unit.”
