

¹¹³Nb

¹¹³Nb was discovered by Bernas et al. in 1997, as reported in “Discovery and Cross-Section Measurement of 58 New Fission Products in Projectile-Fission of 750-A MeV ²³⁸U” ([1997Be70](#)). The experiment was performed using projectile fission of ²³⁸U at 750 MeV/nucleon on a beryllium target at GSI in Germany. “Fission fragments were separated using the fragment separator FRS tuned in an achromatic mode and identified by event-by-event measurements of ΔE -B ρ -ToF and trajectory.” During the experiment, 8 individual counts for ¹¹³Nb were recorded.
