

## $^{106}\text{Tc}$

$^{106}\text{Tc}$  was observed by von Baeckmann and Feuerstein as described in the 1965 paper “Über Spalt-Technetium I” ([1965Vo06](#)).  $^{239}\text{Pu}$  was irradiated with thermal neutrons in the Karlsruhe FR-2 reactor. The activities were identified by a  $\beta$  absorption analysis following chemical separation: “Für  $^{106}\text{Tc}$  und  $^{107}\text{Tc}$  ergaben sich die Halbwertszeiten zu  $37\pm 4$  s und  $29\pm 3$  s.” [The extracted half-lives for  $^{106}\text{Tc}$  and  $^{107}\text{Tc}$  were  $37\pm 4$  s and  $29\pm 3$  s, respectively.]
