

¹²⁰Rh

Bernas et al. discovered ¹²⁰Rh in 1994 at GSI, Germany, as reported in “Projectile fission at relativistic velocities: A novel and powerful source of neutron-rich isotopes well suited for in-flight isotopic separation” (1994Be24). The isotopes were produced using projectile fission of ²³⁸U at 750 MeV/nucleon on a lead target. “Forward emitted fragments from ⁸⁰Zn up to ¹⁵⁵Ce were analyzed with the Fragment Separator (FRS) and unambiguously identified by their energy-loss and time-of-flight.” The experiment yielded 13 individual counts of ¹²⁰Rh.
