

¹²⁸Pd

The discovery of ¹²⁸Pd was reported in the 2010 article “Identification of 45 new neutron-rich isotopes produced by in-flight fission of a ²³⁸U beam at 345 MeV/nucleon,” by Ohnishi et al. (2010Oh02). The experiment was performed at the RI Beam Factory at RIKEN, where the new isotopes were created by in-flight fission of a 345 MeV/nucleon ²³⁸U beam on a beryllium target. The isotopes were separated and identified with the BigRIPS superconducting in-flight separator. The results for the new isotope discovered in this study were summarized in a table. 13 individual counts for ¹²⁸Pd were recorded.
