

In the 2018 paper “Observation of new neutron-rich isotopes among fission fragments from in-flight fission of 345 MeV/nucleon ^{238}U : Search for new isotopes conducted concurrently with decay measurement campaigns” Shimizu et al. reported the discovery of ^{146}I (2018Sh11). The RIKEN RIBF accelerator complex was used to bombard a 2.92-mm-thick beryllium target with a 345 MeV/nucleon ^{238}U beam. Fission fragments were then identified following the BigRIPS and the ZeroDegree spectrometer. The subsequent decays were recorded with the EURICA setup. A table listed the counts and production cross sections for the newly identified nuclides. In two different spectrometer settings a total of 128 ^{146}I events were observed.
