

## **$^{169}\text{Tm}$**

In 1934, Aston reported the first observation of  $^{169}\text{Tm}$  in “Constitution of Dysprosium, Holmium, Erbium, Thulium, Ytterbium and Lutecium” ([1934As02](#)). The rare earth elements were analyzed with the Cavendish mass spectrograph. “Thulium (69) is simple 169.”
