

^{192}Au

^{192}Au was observed by Wilkinson at the University of California at Berkeley in 1948, as reported in “Some Isotopes of Platinum and Gold” ([1948Wi01](#)). Helium and deuteron beams of the 60-inch Crocker Laboratory cyclotron bombarded iridium and platinum targets, respectively. Half-lives were measured following chemical separation. For an observed 4.7 hour activity a “provisional assignment to mass 192 has been made on the basis of reaction yields, and absence of any daughter activity.”
