

¹⁹⁵Au

¹⁹⁵Au was observed by Wilkinson at the University of California at Berkeley in 1948, as reported in “Some Isotopes of Platinum and Gold” ([1948Wi01](#)). Helium and deuteron beams of the 60-inch Crocker Laboratory cyclotron bombarded iridium and platinum targets, respectively. Half-lives were measured following chemical separation. A 190-day activity was observed: “...allocation to mass 195 is consistent with the yields and the half-life is consistent with expectations for a gold isotope of this mass number.”
