

$^{122}\text{Ag-1}$

The 200 ms isomer of ^{122}Ag was first observed in 2000 by K.L.Kratz et al. at CERN, Geneva, Switzerland ([2000Kr18](#)). The paper also reported another isomer with a half-life of 550 ms (which had previously been assigned $^{122}\text{Ag-1}$), however, it was not observed in a recent Penning trap mass spectrometry experiment ([2024Ja10](#)).
