The 1.45 m isomer of ¹⁹²Ir was first observed in 1947 by M. Goldhaber et al. at Argonne National Laboratory, Argonne, Illinois ([1947Go23](#)). The isomer was previously assigned to ¹⁹⁴Ir ([1937Mc04](#)).
